# Voting Requirements Planning Program Board, Committee & Commissions

To determine the number of votes it takes to carry a motion, the "rule" is that a majority of the votes cast by the <u>members present and voting</u> shall carry a vote (a quorum being present); unless, a larger vote is required by another statute or ordinance.

This guide outlines the votes required to pass motions for the Board, Committees, and Commissions supported by the Planning & Development Department's Planning Program, including citations for the specified voting requirements where they exist.

A few notes on calculating votes:

- Abstentions: If a member abstains from a vote, they are counted towards the presence of a quorum, but not counted towards the number of members 'present and voting' when calculating the majority.
- Recusals: If a member is recused from a matter, they are not counted towards the quorum or the number of members present and voting.

## **Planning Board**

## 7 members

#### Quorum = 4

- Special Permits 5 (two-thirds of full board)<sup>1</sup>
- Regulatory Agreements Majority of members present & voting, a quorum being present<sup>2</sup>
- ANR Plans 4 (Majority of the full Board)<sup>3 4</sup>
- Subdivisions 4 (Majority of the full Board)<sup>2</sup>
- Zoning Amendment Recommendations Majority of the members present and voting, a quorum being present

- Special Permits 4<sup>1</sup>
- Appeals 4<sup>4</sup>
- Comprehensive Permits 3 (Majority of full board) <sup>6</sup>

# Old Kings Highway Regional Historic District Committee

5 members, 2 alternates

Quorum = 3

• Majority of the members present and voting (a quorum being present)

"The concurring vote of a majority of the members of the Committee <u>acting upon an application</u> shall be necessary to make a determination in favor of the applicant on any matter upon which the Committee is required to pass under this Act. In the event of a tie vote, the certificate shall be considered denied unless the Committee votes to defer action until the next Committee meeting."

# Hyannis Main Street Waterfront Historic District Commission

### 7 members, 3 alternates Quorum = 4<sup>7</sup>

• Certificates = 4 (Majority of full Commission)<sup>8</sup>

# Barnstable Historical Commission

7 members, 1 alternate Quorum = 4

• Majority of members present and voting (a quorum being present)
